



2019 Governor's Heritage Preservation Honor Awards



Call for Nominations

The Arizona Preservation Foundation and the State Historic Preservation Office/ Arizona State Parks invite your nominations for the annual Governor's Heritage Preservation Honor Awards. Each year awards are given to individuals, businesses, organizations, and/or projects in recognition of outstanding achievements in preserving Arizona's prehistoric and historic resources.

The mission of the Governor's Heritage Preservation Honor Awards is to:

- Promote public awareness of historic preservation in the state of Arizona;
- Publicly recognize the varied contributions by volunteers, professionals, organizations, and agencies to promote the goals of historic preservation;
- Identify and recognize educational, community, non-profit, and private-sector heritage projects that demonstrate excellence in design and execution.

This year, presentation of the awards will take place at an evening reception on Thursday, June 13, 2019, in conjunction with the 2019 Arizona Historic Preservation Conference Hassayampa Inn, 122 East Gurley Street, followed by the awards ceremony at the Elk's Theater, 117 East Gurley Street, Prescott, Arizona.

While there are no specific categories, nominations can address any aspect of heritage preservation achievement including: restoration, rehabilitation, stabilization, or preservation efforts by individuals, businesses, organizations, or communities that have had a positive effect on our historic or cultural resources; contribution to increasing awareness of preservation through activities or educational programs; or outstanding achievement towards preservation of historic or archaeological resources. Successful nominations will be completed projects or undertakings that have resulted in clear, demonstrable benefit to the public or subject resource.

Selection of Honor Awards and Grand Award

A panel of judges representing the fields of archaeology, architecture, history, and preservation will review the nominations. Honor Award winners will be chosen and announced before the conference; the James W. Garrison Heritage Award winner will be chosen from among the winners and announced at the end of the ceremony.

Additional documentation may be requested from nominees of those winners, including professional biographical information, an expanded description of the project, a list of project participants, and additional photos and/or slides.

Submission Requirements

Nominations must include the following:

1. A copy of the complete nomination, including: nomination form (see page 3) all supporting materials, including photos on a CD, DVD or Flash Drive.
2. A minimum of one page narrative statement supporting why such recognition should be given. This narrative should briefly identify the scope of the nominee's (individual/organization/project) achievement in the field of historic preservation. It should also provide clear support for the exceptional quality of the nominee's preservation efforts (in terms of community and/or economic development, scientific and/or historic research, innovation in preservation and/or planning). The impact of the nominee's work should further be discussed in terms of its long-term impact on the preservation of Arizona's heritage.
3. Digital photographs, especially "before" and "after" shots of projects, must be included to aid in judging the nomination and recognize the award recipients in the awards presentation, press materials, and website. Adequate supportive information, such as additional narrative, may also be included to convey the importance of the accomplishment to be nominated. A minimum of ten photos is suggested.

Format of supportive materials

Submissions must include a CD, DVD or Flash Drive of photos for multimedia use, as well as a printed copy of the photos.

High-quality digital submissions of visual materials are required, and will be used in visual presentations of the award winners at the awards ceremony. Submit digital images on a CD, DVD or Flash Drive in TIFF, JPEG or PNG format. Include a reference page with file names and descriptions for photos.

The printed/photocopied photos should be on 8.5" x 11" paper. Black & white photographs are acceptable, however color may be needed to convey important information. Maps, graphs or drawings that convey the project and its location are encouraged.

All submitted materials will become the property of the Arizona State Historic Preservation Office and will not be returned.
